*****Very Important Information! Please Read Carefully! Mark you Calendars!*****

This is the final show letter you will receive. It contains rehearsal schedule and policies, ticket information, volunteer information, when skaters should arrive, locker room policies and building information.

REHEARSALS

- Attendance at all rehearsals is required and very important to the quality of our ice show. Skaters should be at the rink and ready to skate at least 15 minutes before their scheduled rehearsal time.
- Attendance is taken at ALL rehearsals. Arriving late or leaving early counts as a half miss.
- When you are on the ice, please watch out for other skaters who are rehearsing. Please be courteous and respectful of the other groups on the ice during rehearsals.
- **Friday March 14th** is our **technical rehearsal**. We will stop frequently to set lights, props, music, etc. Skaters: wear your practice clothing.
- **Saturday March 15th** is our **dress rehearsal**. We will make as few stops as possible. Skaters: wear your make up and costumes to this rehearsal.
- These last rehearsals are critical to producing an entire show of which we can all be proud. We ask you for your patience and cooperation.
- Help your skater get to all rehearsals on time. Encourage them to work hard and pay attention.
- Be supportive and calm during show week. Plan ahead for simple dinners, rehearsal snacks and show snacks.
- Be patient during rehearsals. We try to anticipate problems and schedule accordingly, but there are inevitably delays.
- During technical and dress rehearsal the basic skills skaters will be brought in by their group for the Finale. You may not leave until you are told to do so. At the end of each half the director calls back the numbers that need an additional run through.
- Please read the rehearsal schedule carefully to know when you practice.

LOCKER ROOMS

- Locker rooms will be assigned for technical and dress rehearsal as well as show days. You will use the same locker room all days. NO SWITCHING!
- Once in the locker room, your child is expected to stay during the entire show. No leaving except to skate their number. They are allowed to watch the show during Technical rehearsal only.
- From Friday night on, the lockers rooms will be locked at night and you are to store your costumes, skates, etc in the locker room.
- Do not wear your costume to the rink.
- There will be locker room attendants assigned to ALL locker rooms to assist the children and keep everyone safe and sound.
- Please do not remain in the locker room after bringing your child downstairs. You may help get skates and costumes on, but then you need to go into the bleacher area. There will be movies, games, coloring books, etc for them to watch and do.
- If there is a problem we will find you in the rink.
- Please have their **NAME** on all costumes and skates.
- Do not bring valuables to the rink (ie: jewelry, ipods, gameboys, etc) We are not responsible for any lost or stolen belongings.
- Please talk with your child about appropriate behavior while waiting in the locker room. No goofing, swearing, ruining others belongings, turning off lights, etc. All children need to be respectful of each other and others belongings. Any problems, they may be asked to leave the show.

SHOW DAYS

- Enter through the main doors. Skaters use the doors to the left in the foyer for locker room access. DO NOT use the elevator!
- Parents wishing to enter the locker room area need to pay first before going downstairs. Please have your hand marked. You will not be allowed downstairs otherwise. Someone will be posted at the door. No exceptions. Please come back upstairs the same way you went down and then enter the rink area from up above.
- Skaters should be in their locker room dressed, skates on and ready to go 20 minutes prior to the start of the show. Locker room attendants will be there.
- Skaters provide and apply their own makeup. Skates should be polished, laces clean and tucked in for safety reasons. Costumes and accessories should be securely fastened.
- There is a general warm up for all skaters prior to the start of the show. All levels may use this ice.
- **SKATE GUARDS** should be on your blades at all times if you are not on the ice. Please wear your skate guards while in the locker room or on the bleachers during technical rehearsal while watching the show. The base of the bleachers will dull blades and cause problems on the ice. If your child does not have Skate Guards, please go purchase a pair.
- NO CHEWING GUM AT ANY TIME.

- Skaters are not allowed to leave their locker room and enter the bleacher area, concession area or any other part of the building during the show at anytime. Once in the locker room, they remain until the end of the show. **This is for safety and security of all children.** If they want drink or food please have them bring it with them at the beginning of the show. **No peanut/nut products due to allergies.**
- After the Finale, promptly pick up your child from the locker room.
- Whenever entering the audience, please remember that everyone has paid for a ticket. Always enter or leave in between show numbers (not during a show number).

SHOW TICKET INFORMATION

Ticket Prices:

All tickets are \$6

Children 4 years old and under are free

- All tickets are General Admission and good for either show.
- You will be receiving 8 tickets. You can buy or sell them. We ask that all skaters buy or try and sell their tickets. This is one of the fundraising opportunities the club does to try and offset ice costs.
- You have been marked down for the numbers on your tickets. Money and unused tickets can be turned in at the table in the lobby(Pam Gregory) on technical or dress rehearsal. Please make sure your name gets marked off otherwise you will be billed the \$48 for the tickets. It is your responsibility.
- Please do not turn in money or unused tickets on the day of the show. The people selling tickets may not have access to the records.
- I encourage all families to purchase the tickets in advance.
- Please note skaters will not need to purchase a ticket.

SHOW DVD, PICTURES, SHOUT OUT PAGE, BASKET RAFFLE

DVD's will be available for purchase through March 16. This is a great way to enjoy your child's performance again. A table will be set up at the show.

Show pictures will be delivered to the rink as soon as they are available.

A Shout Out Page is available this year in the program. What a great way to give your child, grandchild, friend or sibling a "Way to go"! Cost is \$10 per 70 character line and due date has been extended to **Feb. 20.**

Again, this year we will have a basket raffle at the show. This is a fundraiser to help pay for ice cost, coaching costs, lighting, etc for the show. We are asking for donations. Please contact Pam Gregory or Carla Kruncos for information on how you can help.

VOLUNTEERS

The success of the show is dependent upon the great volunteer help we receive from the parents of the skaters. If you have not yet volunteered for anything, there are many jobs out there for you to do. Below is a brief description of the help we need. Please help us by offering to volunteer your time and talents.

It takes a tremendous amount of time and effort to produce our annual show. The professional staff directs the artistic portion, while parent volunteers coordinate the business and non-artistic portions of the show. We are once again counting on the parents of the skaters to help in the next weeks before the show. If you haven't already made a commitment, PLEASE consider helping. It doesn't matter if your child has been skating two months or ten years. We need all the help we can get.

Most parents will be at the rink on Technical and Dress rehearsal evenings when decorating and set up/teardown is done. Please lend a hand. The more we have helping the sooner we can all enjoy watching our children practice!

Please remember all full members need to fulfill their 10-hour volunteer requirement and this does go towards that. You will be marked down for the hours you volunteer.

We need help in the following areas:

Set up/teardown/decoration on ice- Putting up paper and backdrops.

Prop making-Making decorations for on and off ice.

Locker Room Monitors-If you have a child in the locker room (which everyone does) and do not wish for them to be unsupervised while waiting to perform or to be picked up, please volunteer at one of the performances or rehearsals.

Hallway monitors/number cues-Collect skaters from locker rooms and make sure everyone finds their place.

Lobby decorating-decorated on Friday night

Rink glass removal- Need 3-4 dads for this job. Takes about an hour.

We definitely need help with teardown after the show. Please consider. The more people the quicker it goes.

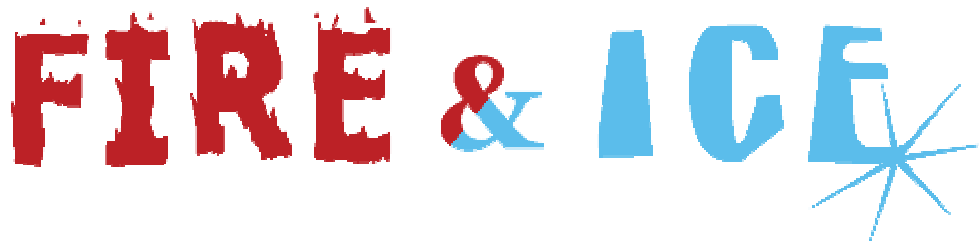

Costume Guidelines

For **FIRE AND ICE**

All hair will be parted on the right, swooping to left and back into ponytail. Use a rubberband close to your hair color. If hair is short, please pull back off face as best as possible.

Make-up can be done to your discretion.

We will finalize outfit at pictures. Please bring all pieces with.

Burning love- Wear tutu, leotard and clip hairpiece in at ponytail.

Dancing in the Dark- Wear skirt, hat and leotard.

Heat Wave- Wear dress and head piece on pony(?).

Hazy Shade of Winter- wear straight skirt, leotard and headpiece on pony.

What time is It- Wear leotard, pants, tutu and headpiece on pony

Great Balls of Fire- Wear dress

Crazy Thing- Wear dress and strings tied on ponytail

California Dreaming- Wear dress and headband around head

Ice Ice baby-Wear leotard, skirt, leg warmers over skates and head band around head

Cool-Wear dress, briefs and hairpiece on ponytail

Cold Heated-Wear leotard, skirt, head piece as head band(?)

Performing Line-Wear pants, top and headband. No feathers

Junior Line- Wear pants, top, armbands from mid upper arm to mid lower arm and headband

Senior line-Wear pant outfit, hairpiece(?)

Sr/Jr Opening- Wear outfit
